

CHOLESTEROL SCREENING

High blood cholesterol affects over 65 million Americans. It can be a serious condition as it increases the risk for heart disease, yet has no symptoms. Research indicates that lowering blood cholesterol levels lessens the risk for developing heart disease and reduces the chances of heart attack or stroke.

Visiting Nurse & Hospice of Fairfield County will offer a cholesterol screening at its offices in Wilton. The screening measures total cholesterol, HDL, LDL, glucose and triglycerides, as well as blood pressure and body mass calculation. A confidential cardiovascular risk counseling session with a Registered Nurse will be provided.
